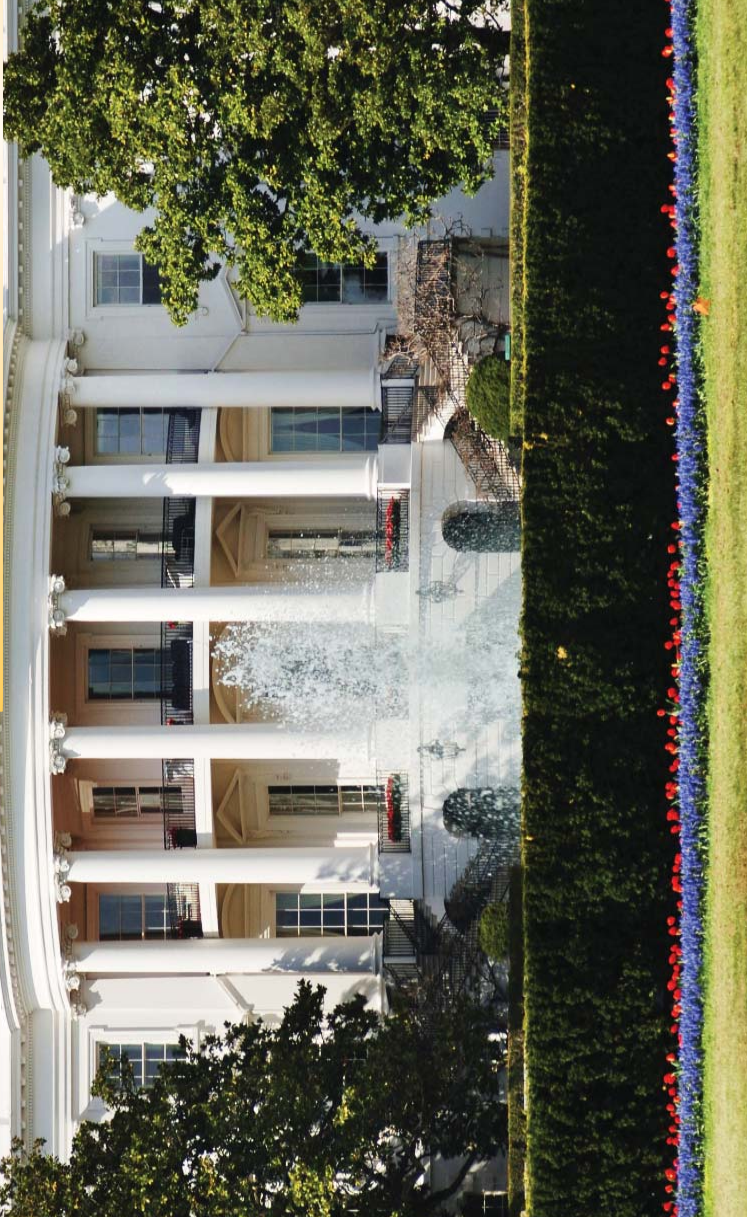

2011 GEORGETOWN DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARD IN DIABETIC LIMB SALVAGE William J. Ennis, DO, MBA, FACOS



Dr. Ennis is Professor of Clinical Surgery, Division of Vascular Surgery, and Chief, Section of Wound Healing and Tissue Repair, at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC); Medical Director, Comprehensive Wound and Disease Management Center at St. James Hospitals and Medical Centers, Crestwood Care Sub-acute Wound Unit; and Chief Medical Officer, Acelecare Wound Centers.

After graduating Phi Beta Kappa from the State University of New York at Stony Brook, Dr. Ennis earned his medical degree at the New York College of Osteopathic Medicine. He completed residencies in and is board certified in General Surgery, Vascular Surgery and Family Medicine. Dr. Ennis also earned an MBA from the Keller Graduate School of Management in Chicago.

For more than two decades, Dr. Ennis has been at the leading edge of wound care medicine. An internationally known educator and speaker, he is the immediate Past President of the AAWC. At UIC he founded the nation's first academic, physician-based fellowship in wound care.

"Bill Ennis has advanced the science of wound healing by using science in approaching every wound problem, by reporting his data with brutal honesty and by being a superb teacher. His contributions cannot be overlooked as we have all sought to emulate in some way his approach to wound care," said Dr. Christopher E. Attinger, DLS Conference Co-Chairman.

Conference Co-Chairman Dr. John S. Steinberg said: "Bill has practiced and taught under the key principles of evidence-based medicine and a patient-focused treatment plan. He has always been on the cutting edge of new technology for wound healing, but at the same time is grounded in outcomes and data in medical decision making. He represents and embraces the multidisciplinary team approach that is so essential to diabetic limb salvage."

"Dr. Ennis' unique education, training and experience in vascular medicine combined with his wound healing expertise make him a quintessential clinical, research, and teaching leader in our specialties," said Co-Chairman Dr. Richard F. Neville.

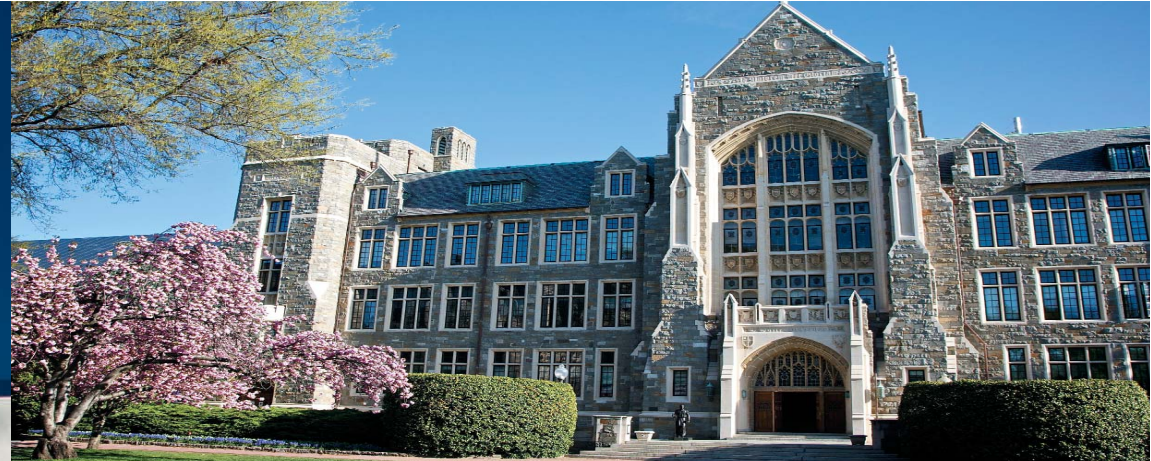

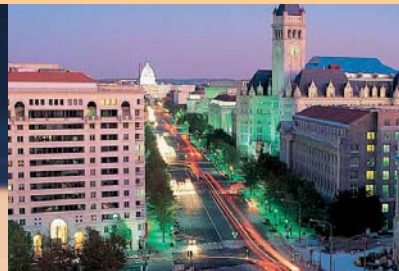
